What is Aarambh Child Care Centre (A3C)

As an early education provider Aarambh Child Care Centre (A3C) work in partnership with families to offer consistent, loving care for young children.

Why is A3C

For the habilitation of children and preparing for readiness to gain admission in mainstream schools

Project Coverage

A3C serves in East and Northeast Delhi Districts and contains two municipal council zones (Shahdara north and Shahdara south). The project is targeting to cover about 5 Km2 Areas having about 3 lakhs population and more than 1000 children having intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Target Group

A3C Services are available to children who:

- Are aged birth to school-entry and live in project areas specially in East Delhi region
- · Are at risk due to prematurity, low birth weight or other birth complications
- Have development delays
- Have a disability such as: Autism Spectrum Disorder, Intellectual Disability, Specific Learning Disabilities, Mental Illness, Blindness or Low-vision, Speech and Language disability, Hearing Impairment (deaf and hard of hearing), Cerebral Palsy, Multiple Disabilities etc.

Desired Developmental Changes:

A3C clinically assesses each child and planning through Individualized Family Support programmes and monitoring the five primary developmental changes in:

- Ability to move, see, and hear—physical development
- Ability to talk, understand, and expressing needs—language and speech development
- Ability to relate to others—social and emotional development
- Ability to eat, dress, and take care of themselves—self help (or adaptive development)
- Ability to think and learn—cognitive development

Indicators of A3C

1: Parents and Family Involvement:

Maintain a relationship with the parents and families for gaining attention of their Children with Disability.

- Parent's/Family cooperation for the empowerment with the children with the disability to informing learning objective/s.
- Parents understanding for providing feedback.
- Review of the parents to present the stimulus or material.

2: Support through quality staff:

- A guideline for Caregivers to help children to achieve their learning objective/s.
- Assessment of performance by special educator of children.
- Speech Therapists, Physiotherapist and Occupational Therapist for assessment and management.

3: Coordination with the schools:

- Inclusion coordinator networking with mainstream schools and other Systems.
- Do advocacy with and on behalf of parents for admission.

A3C Confidentiality:

A3C is committed to protect the privacy of children and family. We support and are bound by privacy policy of Manovikas Charitable Society and strict confidentiality is maintained at all times. In order to plan programs with child we need to collect information from different sources. This information helps us to assess and plan programs in partnership with child, family, school and community. We do not disclose personal information about child and family to other people or organisations without the consent, unless we are required to do so by law. The reports can look at the child's file at any time, or request a copy of information in the file.

In this report children's names are changed as well as it is not inevitably pictures are displayed to protect the privacy of children and family

A3C Health Policies:





Riya received high quality hearing aid cost of Rs. 57.2K and she has started interacting with peers, neighborhood, and learning has become easy and meaningful.

Three Key accomplishments of Q2

ADMISSION Application Accepted

Nine children's application for admission was successfully accept by the Directorate of Education of NCT of Govt. of Delhi.

ATTENTION Interest Development

Four students with attention deficit and hyperactive disorder have increased their sitting tolerance and taking interest in activities.

ACCEPTANCE Sharing Joy

All children now have started interacting with peers they are sharing their joy and laughter together

Challenges and Plan of Action

Challenge faced

Family members are reluctant and not willing to support for their children with special needs.

Three parents have withdrawn their child, when A3C provided the options of inclusive schooling. They do not want to send their child to regular school.

Action taken

Monthly home visits have done to provided encouragement to draw their attention towards their children disability.

Action taken/plan for issue resolution: Telephonic conversation and home visit by Special Educators have prepared them to understand the importance of training and education, which will change everyone's lives.



Activity Performance

Activities designed for the children are based on the clinical assessment and Individualised Family Support Plan (IFSP). Reporting some of the activities conducted during the Q1 and Q2:

Training on activities of daily living (ADL)

Trained special educators and caregivers provide ADL training and during last two quarters 70% improvements found in performing ADL activities in the children. They are brushing teeth, washing hands, unbuttoning, and buttoning their cloths, maintaining hygiene in home. Families have been trained on importance of taking bath every day.

Eleven children are independent in ADL.

Cognitive and Academics Development

Cognitive developments have been recognized in 90% children who have attended A3C. Functional academics improvements have been noticed in six children, during conceptualization of phonetics, symbolic learning in Hindi and English vocabularies. Numerical and concepts of prepositions have improved in five children. Children have enjoyed in learning colors, shapes, identifying animals, birds, shapes, vegetables, and fruits. The audiovisual sessions on moral stories are best choice for all children.

Therapeutic Intervention

Student attending speech therapy sessions showed significant improvement in their articulation.

Students were initially in the stage of producing sounds like 'a-a', 'b-b' and now they have started speaking two letter words like 'papa' etc. Students with less control over the dental and









Yoga and Meditation

Yoga is a regular activity in A3C to improve body posture, sitting for meditation, adding reclining, standing, inverted, twisting, and balancing poses has enhanced the ability to sit for extended periods for the children those who having lack of attention and hyperkinesia. Children enjoy breathing exercise that helps in relaxation of body and mind.

The trained Yoga expert conducts yoga and meditation classes for the children who have been positive affect in children with autism spectrum disorder (ASD), attention deficit and hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) and specific learning difficulty (SpLD).

Pottery Class

Clay is fascinating and it lends itself to student's skill level. The pottery class in A3C is never boring, children always explore beyond imaginations. It has been observed that children try out to create an interesting playful activity, makes beautiful images and objects through clay. The pottery class brings smile on their face.

Computer Learning

At Manovikas, Home of Hope has facilitated the computer training in Aaryaman Center for Excellence (ACE). The ACE computer lab provides an initial understanding of technology and tools, instructional leaning support for the A3C children. It also helps in building communication skills and support for disability accommodation in functional learning of children.

Three children enjoy playing games on mobile, listening songs on You tube, chatting through video chat with their friends.

Music and Dance

At A3C Music and dance is a therapeutic involvement of children to built their Self-confidence and improve public presentation. Children are participating in events in house and outside Manovikas and received appreciations and three prizes in last tow quarter.





Games

A3C children have special needs even in physical movements. The regular playing with easy games like catching and passing the ball, running, hitting target, musical chairs and football etc. has helped in building their stamina and keeping themselves active and physically flexible.

We are also targeting to invent the interest of these children to participate in Special Olympics in future.

Art, Craft and Colouring Activity

Fostering creativity won't just increase Aarambh Children's chances of becoming the best Artist. At A3C these activities helping children develop mentally, socially, and emotionally, and it has been observed creating art boosted 13 children's ability to analyze and problem-solve in myriad ways.

Most important, when five children with high support needs (severely and profoundly disabled) feel good while they are creating, art helps boost self-confidence.

Two children have participated in painting competition outside the A3C and Afreen won the first position.

Outings

Between A3C activities, therapies, and the challenges of "play dates," it can be hard to imagine all A3C Children with special needs have taken part in after-school activities at Pratapgarh Farms on October 5, 2018. The reality, is that the this picnic was the terrific opportunities for these children to show their strengths, build confidence, make friends, and discover new interests.

It was a wonderful day outing and children, teachers enjoyed and had fun with different rides like camel ride, camel cart ride, Bullock cart ride and tractor ride. It was very fascinating for them while enjoying mud bath and puppet dance.

Celebrations

A3C focused to specially value the very close caretaker of the children. In the last two quarters during the Mother's day and Grandparents' days, singing, games and high tea party were organized at A3C.

Most of The Grandparents were delighted to receive the pleasurable recognition as a family's greatest treasure, the founders of a loving legacy, the greatest story tellers and keepers of traditions and it was our owner to celebrate their day and bring smile on their face. The mothers have enjoyed the party joyfully.

Celebrating children's birthdays gives blissful feelings, enjoyments, and fun for all.



Working with Community and Family

Community Awareness

A3C gives importance of disability awareness and it has been given prominence in the last two quarters, making it easier for the children with disabilities and the society to develop empathy for one another. Awareness on paradigm shift from medical model to social model, at two prominent hospitals- Chacha Nehru Children's Hospital and Institute for Human Behavior and Allied Science (IHBAS), nearby A3C two disability awareness visits were organized. It helped in subsiding the stereotypical mindset of the society and doctors, hence provided vast opportunities for everyone to get involved in creating a positive, inclusive society for all.

Sh. Anil Bajpayee, Member of Legislative Assembly (MLA) of East Delhi, has provided the community center in Kailash Nagar to organize the disability screening camps in the area and there were five Children and parents have attended the camp.

Social Media Publicity during World Autism Day and Month

It was an interesting exercise to research what has worked well in A3C in terms of changes in the kids with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), many of which teachers hadn't seen before focusing on what children have in common rather than what makes them different (i.e. wanting to make friends and be part of a group). Raising awareness of the signs of Autism to families because early intervention is so crucial to outcomes in later life, A3C's four stories on ASD were published in social media platform on Face book, Twitter and Manovikas website.

Home Visits

The 90% children of A3C are from the urban slum community where parents and family education via home visit service help them to understand their own family's needs, strengths, and challenges. During last two quarters 25 individualized family support plans are developed to identify the appropriate activities and it was most helpful for the child's healthy development. Fifteen home visits done on a weekly or monthly basis depending on each family's needs.



Working with Community and Family

Parent's Training Programme

Parents with intellectual and developmental disabilities at A3C are finding it more difficult than other parents to provide adequate childcare. Two parents training programmes were conducted and it has been observed that families of children with special needs due to their slow-paced often face many challenges and generally to organize their family environment and to obtain resources that meet the needs of their children, they are doing efforts and most of them are not willing to send their child to the mainstream schools.

About 95% A3C families have negative effects of having a child with disability caused tension in the family especially the parents. Twenty-five out of thirty parents are economically marginalized and their child attending A3C program and the first people that are directly communicate with child's feelings of guilt, frustration and deprivation due to lack of normal children can cause isolation and lack of interest in relation to environment and also lower self-esteem and feelings of inferiority and worthlessness and sadness in them that all these are affecting their parenting style.

In the last two quarters, A3C focused the parents training on Transition of their child in the mainstream schools. After training, guidance and assistance three parents were ready and understood usefulness and benefits of inclusion of their child in to mainstream schools.

Parents Teacher Meeting

At A3C, it is important for parents to remember that they have a right to be a part of their child's disability intervention, development, education and attend meetings to go over their son or daughter's individualized family support plan (IFSP). Parents are a key part to creating, revising, and encouraging their child with special needs' development. During last year A3C have Conducted three parents teacher meeting and discussed the performance of child, scope of improvement and their comments and suggestions were noted in IFSP.





Resources and Facilities

Mrs. Vineeta Bhandari, President, Building Kidz Inc. Financially supports to A3C. All services and facilities are free of cost. Children receive care, therapies, training, education stationary, notebooks, uniform, transportation and midday nutrition. We receive the fundings through Home of Hope Inc.

A high quality hearing aid to Riya

Riya lives in urban slum area of East Delhi, and soon after she was born her family noticed that she was not responding to sounds around her. When Riya brought to A3C at the age of 10 years, at A3C we took her to the Audiologist and ENT doctor for a hearing assessment where it was confirmed she had a severe hearing loss. Riya's family was devastated, as they had no idea how to deal with this challenge. The Speech Therapist at A3C, recommended hearing aids for Riya.

Thanks to Building Kidz School's financial support for giving Riya a pair of hearing aids. As the hearing aids were turned on, Riya immediately responded to the sounds around her. She was then enrolled into A3C's early intervention programme where she is making great progress, and learning to listen and speak.







Inclusion in Mainstream Education

A3C's concept of inclusion for young children with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) is based on the simple idea that every child and family is valued equally and deserves the same opportunities and experiences. Children attending A3C programme are prepared for inclusive education—whether the disability is mild or severe, hidden or obvious – participating in everyday activities, just like they would if their disability was not present. It's about building friendships and membership and having opportunities just like everyone else.

Sharing the goals and expectations A3C children, before we meet with the school and decide upon child's Individualized Family Support Plan (IFSP), meet with mainstream teachers, counselors and special educators and others to discuss the goals, expectations, and future placement preferences for child.

Developing a responsive behviour in the family and parents the A3C children to know the rights you and your child have to an inclusive education is very important component of the programme.

To promote successful inclusive education our Inclusion Coordinator is actively visiting the mainstream/inclusive schools nearby area. A3C provides teachers support learning in inclusive classrooms in three ways. First, they teach so that students with differing abilities and learning styles can understand and participate. Second, they modify assignments when they are too difficult. Third, they model respect and encourage friendships.

Nine children form A3C programme were prepared for inclusion in the last two quarters. The transition plan was developed and accordingly the Inclusion Coordinator applied Online for the admission of these children. The application for admission was successfully accept by the Directorate of Education of NCT of Govt. of Delhi.

The letter of admission have issued to the parents. When Inclusion Coordinator and parents started visiting for enrolled in Mainstream Schools, most of school denied due to financial liabilities and not being aware to provide support for children with special needs. Some school gave positive response too.

Advocating Inclusion of A3C Children:

Creating network with Directorate of Education of NCT of Govt. of Delhi and mainstream schools regular communications are continued. The letter regarding the issues, difficulties and suggested fortitudes were given to the concerned authorities.

Visit of Captain Arjun Rana from Indian Navy along with wife Ms. Anju Rana and son, Dr. Abhimanyu Rana. They are supports of Aaryaman Center for Excellence (ACE-Computer Lab) in Manovikas. 
